

DISTRICT SPLIT OVER LOG SHAMING

EXCLUSIVE INTERVIEW PINZU PUMPERS, LOG SHAMING SPLITS THE BOARD, MADMAN DETAINED OVER RADIO HIJACK

It's been over a week since the sixth annual league of the /mjg/ district commenced and the streets of the strongest Riichi Mahjong community in the West remain abuzz. One particular topic has risen to the top of the chattering Jyanshi's minds, and this bird-brain reporter is back in the City to hear all about it.

own in the Jyansous of the /mjg/district few things are taboo; but recently there has been fierce public backlash to a seemingly innocuous practice: a televised mahjong game review.


A few helpful Jyanshi pointed them in the right direction but many indulged the Jyanshi providing rare stickers for them to save

WEEK ONE: THE SCORES ON THE BOARD

A GREAT WEEK FOR SANBYAKU SHAMISEN, ROMANCE OF THE CAT KINGDOM, AND JET SET RIICHI. CAN THE REST KEEP UP?

In a tumultuous first week the top spots have been constantly traded. Two titans sit atop the leader board as the week closed: Tonkatsu Yamiten and Romance of the Cat Kingdom.

ith a truly commanding first week showing Romance of the Cat Kingdom and Mayaku Shikiten only lost points in one session each, and hold a +250 point lead over 4th and 400 over 8th, placing them comfortably within the all important top eight placement going into Week 2. In order to qualify for the semi-finals teams need to reach the Top 8 by the end of Week 5. However with how volatile the (+45, +5, -15, -35) Uma spread is swings of 100 points are not unusual, and the pack leaders' precipitious lead could evaporate in just a few sessions.

Large point swings

The current largest negative point swing this season has been from Pinzu Pumpers with a -127.5 point loss in one session, though there have been over half a dozen -100 point swings just in the first week alone. The largest point gain was scored early on in AUS3 by Bakyou Heat – an eye-watering +191.1 point gain, again one of more than half a dozen +100 point gains.

The gigantic +187.5 point swing in a recent session from Jet Set Riichi propelled them from 6th to 2nd. With a Dealer Yakuman – Kokushi Musou – scored in South 3 Honba 2 they ended their second hanchan +114.9, the biggest point score from a single hanchan so far, and cementing the player as the highest overall scorer in Week 1.

Ending -84.9 in the red Rozen Maiden: Füritend secured the title of worst single hanchan in the league so far in EUX 2 game one. Not an unsurprising result given that the player was a miko but more surprising was that the Jyanshi never dealt in to anything bigger than a Mangan; a testament to the fickle nature of Mahjong. A different player from the same team claimed the coveted Jobber of the League award.

Taking a look at the fantasy column

The concurrent fantasy league – in which the denizens of /mjg/ draft a team from their favourite league players – currently stands with A.U.T.I.S.M. Destiny Redux, HAT4LIFE, and KAAAAAAAAAAAAA at the front with +671.6, +510.9, and +371.4 respectively, soaring ahead of the official frontrunners. While a team composed of only one player, the famous X from Jet Set Riichi, has managed 8th place in the fantasy league.

What the next week holds

As two of the Top 8 spots hover precariously around the +-0.0 mark it's not inconceivable that we might see a further stratification of the point spread. Some of the strongest teams on paper (Legend of the Celestial Teapot and Yakupara Cat Café to name two) have ended up near the bottom of the bracket, but given the high degree of variance in Riichi Mahjong perhaps we'll see some comebacks next week.

Lust of the Flesh; The Pride of Life


he streets and bulletin boards of the /mjg/ district were full of chatter once again last monday as the downtrodden denizens of the district discussed the injustices demanded of men to simply live and eat. Labors' humiliations take a heavy toll, and one Jyanshi (>> 52513547'2) justifiably would rather "die a homeless hobo" than suffer the degradations of toil.

Not all Jyanshi's sympathised with their perspective, however others echoed the sentiment and after one Jyanshi drew direct comparison between selling his body and his services on the labor market the conversation turned; the needs of man don't stop at bread: Prostitution was the topic of the hour.

Gratification is a need as much as any other but the denizens of /mjg/ grappled with the realities of paying for pleasure. But one Jyanshi had a much darker annecdote to share. They recounted in their post (>> 525140960) how at a young age they fell victim to the advances of a much older man with the promise of 200 Euros reward for the service. In a shocking tale that I recommend the reader read for themselves they recounted the emotion after returning to their family home: "I didn't feel anything different going back, but my mom told me I had a horrible face when I got home and kept asking me if something bad had happened and kept hugging me while on the verge of tears" concluding that "something completely changed inside my head that day, but I have no regrets, as weird as that sounds.".





It's all to play for.

With some truly massive point swings over the last week we've seen teams change five places over a single session in both directions. The teams that will make that crucial semi-final cutoff will be vying for the last available positions up until the very last session.

Team 15, the Pinzu Pumpers, were dominating going into EU3 when they saw the single largest point loss in the league so far, but despite this they are on a steady climb out of the hole. Despite their best efforts Team 9 has been catching no breaks, with all but two of their sessions ending in the red. In the last few days Team 8, Jet Set Riichi, managed a whopping +187.5 point gain – one of their strongest players scored a Yakuman, Kokushi musou; the first for this edition of the league –on top of a stellar performance. Yet the record from earlier this week remains unbroken.

ONE-HAN CITY'S TOP FINANCIAL ANALYSTS

EXCLUSIVE INTERVIEW WITH THE PINZU PUMPERS

IN THE RUNNING FOR THE SEMIS SINCE THE START OF THE LEAGUE \$PINZU SAW A DRAMATIC CRASH LAST WEEK, BUT WITH THE STOCK RALLYING WE ASKED THE TEAM FOR COMMENT.

Getting a hold of the Pinzu Pumpers was a challenge in and of itself, registered in the financial district of One-Han City the Team's members are strategically positioned across multiple timezones. We managed to get the Team Captain for an interview between flights.

ver a military-grade encrypted channel our call began, the Team's Captain is a busy man, so didn't have much time. We cut straight to the chase: the precipitous crash of the \$PINZU cryptocurrency market: 'anyone using our availability tracker could predict it, we knew our AUS games would be pretty bad since we would probably be pitted against a particular Saint Sara'; Sara, a well known market maverick was indeed a force to be reckoned with, but they had in fact lost the majority of their holdings in a calamitous game against the Grinchlantis Celestial.

"Still, we will aim to not make such demonstrations in the future. [...] We would never drop out of Top 8, it would displease or shareholders [too much]". Since losing their early lead the latter half of Week 1 has seen the Team's valuation rally, at market close they placed 5th overall and trends suggest that they may make back lost

ground to market titans Kakuyaku Rikiten and Romance of the Cat Kingdom.

We asked the Captain what their strategy for the remaining weeks would be in a bull market against the indomitable top 3: "With the points being halved for semis and once again for quarterfinals it doesn't really matter much who is at the top, and by how much. Last year saw DealerEx dragged down from first in semis and ended in them being eliminated. What matters is keeping the float above negative 60 ish. Still I expect the top half to remain largely stable".

The rules of the league allow for massive swings as it's conclusion nears, and as for future \$PINZU market corrections, the captain had this to say: "Of course any price dumping is just another opportunity, so we encourage others to invest in \$PINZU any time it approaches zero. Our long term outlook is positive."

The Pinzu Pumpers have been prolific in their output this league, calling many market moves before they had even happened. But recently they have slowed the output of their predictions, though their powerful prediction model remains Open Source. We asked if they planned to

return to delivering regular market insights: 'Due to circumstances beyond our control ke members were unavailable to deliver market insights, we express our sincerest apologies', but despite the manpower shortage they had future plans to tease: "we indeed plan to expand our operations into other directions as well; in the worst case it should be operational by the midpoint of the league".

A version 2.0 of their prediction model might create radical shifts in the market, or it might crash the whole thing with no survivors. Either way we had one final question for the enigmatic Captain; Who is your favourite Touhou?: "I really enjoy the row duo, even though I haven't cleared StB or DS. Journalism is a powerful tool, and there's not many good news sources around these days.".
